### Intelligence

According to "Encyclopedia of Cat Breeds" by J. Anne Helgren (1997), (which has a rating scale on intelligence and other breed traits) the Balinese is rated the highest in intelligence of all the long-haired breeds, a 9-10 on a scale of 1 to 10.

### Ideal Weight

A Balinese tends to be averaged sized or slightly larger. Males weigh from 12 - 16 lbs, and females 8 - 12 lbs.

### Life Span

The average Balinese life span is around 15 years.

### Litters

Gravity (pregnancy) period lasts 9 weeks, and the litter size averages 3 or 4 kittens. But litters of 5 to 7 kittens are possible.


### Grooming

A Balinese sheds very little fur and its coat usually does not mat, making grooming requirements minimal. Only short haired cats require less grooming.

### Health Problems

Crossed-eyes occasionally occur, although this is not typically considered detrimental to their health or longevity. Modern breeds, in general, are more prone to health problems than the more robust traditional types. In general, the Balinese is prone to the same health problems as Siamese. Be sure to watch out for nystagmus (a slight but very rapid jerking back-and-forth of the eyes) and congenital heart defects.

# Breed Standards

**GENERAL:** The ideal Balinese is a wedge cat with long tapering lines, very little but also moderate and muscular. Excellent physical condition. Neither flabby nor bony. Not fat. Eyes clear. Because of the longer coat the Balinese appears to have softer bone and less extreme type than other breeds of cats with similar type.

**HEAD:** Long, tapering wedge. Medium size in good proportion to body. The total wedge starts at the nose and flares out in straight line to the tips of the ears forming a triangle, which do break at the whiskers. No less than the width of an eye between the eyes. When the whiskers and face hair are smoothed back, the underlying bone structure is apparent. Allowance must be made for joints in the mad cat.

**SKULL:** Flat. In profile, a long straight line should be felt from the top of the head to the tip of the nose. No bulge over the eyes. No dip in nose.

**EARS:** Strikingly large, pointed, wide at base, continuing the lines of the wedge.

**EYES:** Almond shaped. Medium size. Neither protruding nor recessed. Slanted towards the nose in harmony with lines of wedge and ears. Unconcealed.

**NOSE:** Long and straight. A continuation of the forehead with no

break.

**MUZZLE:** Fine, wedge-shaped.

**CHIN and JAW:** Moderate size. Tip of chin level with tip of nose in the same vertical plane. No thick moustache nor excessively massive.

**BODY:** Moderate size. Overall long, but not like a Siamese combination of flee bones and firm muscles. Shoulders not hips continue along neck lines of slender body. Hips not wider than shoulders. Abdomen tight. The male may be considerably larger than the female.

**NECK:** Long and slender.

**LEGS:** Bone structure long and thin. Head kept higher than front in good proportion to body.

**PAWS:** Dainty, small, and oval. Toes fine and close together.

**TAIL:** Bone structure long, thin, tapered in a flee polar. Tail hair sparse but like a plume.

**COAT:** Medium length. Fine, silky without downy undercoat lying close to the body, the coat may appear thicker than silk. Hair is longer on the tail.
